

Get To Know The Enchanted Circle

The Enchanted Circle encompasses Taos, Angel Fire, Eagle Nest, Red River and Questa. Known for its magnificent scenery and outdoor activities, the Enchanted Circle makes an outstanding day trip. Drive time is approximately 3.5 hours, but make plans for frequent stops along the way. It's worth the extra time to discover the hidden treasures of Northern New Mexico.

Town of Taos

Taos Plaza rests at the heart of the historical district, surrounded by shops, galleries and restaurants within easy walking distance, surrounded by quiet residential areas. It has a relatively flat landscape filled with cottonwood trees.

Las Colonias, Blueberry Hill

Arroyo Seco, El Salto

Taos Ski Valley, Valdez, Des Montes

Weimer Foothills
